### IV. Composition: (30%)

Have you ever been mindless? That's not thoughtless; it's mindless—and we all have been. Psychologists call this "automaticity"—putting your brain on autopilot and giving the usual responses, even if you aren't in the appropriate situation....The penalty for mindlessness—letting ourselves operate without thinking in a situation we think we are familiar with—can be as minor as missing our highway exit or putting the cereal in the refrigerator and the milk in the cupboard....

A psychologist says that mindlessness is also at the root of prejudice—but she says the way to solve it is with more discrimination, not less. She reasons that, if we are mindful of each other's individual characteristics—not just race and religion but also height, weight, talent, even hair color—we will understand that each human being is unique.
