English major, but also wanted to become a Ph.D.—a university professor. The project seems abundantly feasible in today's world where graduate fellowships for Afro-Americans go begging. But in 1963, it was a rare occurrence for a black person to set his sights on a traditional Ph.D.—not a doctorate in education, or social work, or physical education—but a traditional Ph.D. in arts and sciences. The person most influential in the decisions I made over the next several years was Charles Watkins. He encouraged my ambitions, guided me to fellowships, quieted my doubts, wrote letters of recommendation, and sketched vistas of intellectual work that glowed in my imagination.
