Part Two (70 points)

Short Essay (70 points): Please write a short essay-like response of about 700 words on only two of the following six questions:

- 1. Discuss the rise of the English Novel, discussing the circumstances and the shift in genre over the years. Don't forget to mention specifically such authors as Defoe, Richardson, Fielding, Austen, Eliot, Dickens, Hardy, Woolfe, Joyce, Orwell, etc. Don't forget to discuss briefly their works and how they contribute to or shape the tradition.
- The Preface to the Lyrical Ballads by Coleridge and Wordsworth sets for their individual goals as well as a definition of the values of the new Romantic movement. Discuss this preface in detail and illustrate how the authors employ these values in specific poems.
- 3. What are the epic conventions of the Classical epic as illustrated in such works as the *Iliad*, *Odyssey*, *Aenid*, *Divine Comedy*, *Paradise Lost*, and apply these to Pope's satiric use of them in his mock-epic, "The Rape of the Lock."
- 4. Discuss the use of "political" satire as illustrated in such works as Thomas Moore's *Utopia*, Jonathan Swift's *Gulliver's Travels*, George Orwell' *Animal Farm*, and Aldous Huxley's *Brave New World*.
- 5. Define "Modernism" as employed by early 20th century <u>novelists</u> and <u>poets</u>. What are their values and in what specific ways are they a rejection of 19th century poetry and fiction. Please refer specifically to ground-breaking works of Modernism in your illustration.
- Discuss Coleridge's Rime of the Ancient Mariner and/or Chinua Achebe's Things
 Fall Apart in terms of ecological criticism. Please refer to specific ideas by
 specific eco-critics in your examination of the work or works.
