- I. Read each passage carefully before answering the questions in its wake. Choose only one that best answers each question. (36分)
 - A) Tumors, like any other cells, need oxygen and nutrients to survive. At first they eat their way through healthy tissue, looking for blood cells to tap for these essentials. Eventually, though, they start to grow their own capillaries and vessels, like oil companies eager to guarantee a steady flow of crude. Dr. Folkman's insight was to look for substances that prevent tumors from building those pipelines.
 - (1) Tumors look for blood cells in order to use a) a steady flow of crude; b) pipelines; c) healthy tissue; d) oxygen and nutrients.

Bangkok Heads Into Critical Days

Tide Complicates Fight Against Floods; Anticrisis Base Also Partly Submerged (1)

BANGKOK—<u>Thai authorities</u> (2) abandoned their crisis operations center at Bangkok's old international airport Saturday because of rising floodwaters as soldiers and volunteers <u>raced</u> <u>against the time</u> (3) to <u>shore up</u> (4) the city's defenses against a massive flow of water that has already <u>inundated</u> (5) parts of the capital and <u>a vast swath</u> (6) of countryside.

Swelling high tides on the Chao Phraya River (湄南河) that winds through the heart of the city make this weekend critical. Rising water levels sweeping in from the Gulf of Thailand (暹邏灣) already are flooding riverside districts such as Bangkok's Chinatown and making it difficult to channel floodwaters from upstream out to the ocean. The tides are expected to <u>peak</u> (7) this weekend.

Bangkok's old international airport – the vast majority of domestic and international flights are now handled by the new Suvarnahbumi complex in the east of the city – has emerged as something of a symbol of Bangkok's fight against the flood. As late as Friday, officials said they would remain there to direct antiflood operations even as floodwaters seeped into the area, <u>stranding</u> (8) aircraft in large pools of water and <u>lapping at</u> (9) the terminal buildings. Justice Minister Pracha Promnok, head of the Flood Relief and Operations Center, on Saturday decided <u>enough was enough</u> (10) and gave the order to relocated to the nearby headquarters of state oil company PTT PCL.

Prime Minister Yingluck Shinawatra (總理盈拉) <u>shrugged off</u> (11) growing criticism here of her government's efforts to cope with the worst flood in a half-century, and told reporters Friday that officials are now <u>stepping up</u> (12) efforts to divert more water away from the Chao Phraya and out to the sea through a network of canals in the east of the city.
